
Content templates are presented next to annotated layouts for reference.


Paul and Luke need to catalog the module types, and component types (reconcile with Paul's module document).


In the Page Editor, can user edit elements that are part of a sublevel page template? For example, can the user edit a Category Tagline at this level?




Can we create module types based on the insert type or RTE functionality? For example, a Graph Module, Story Module, Table Module etc.




Can we create module types based on the insert type or RTE functionality? For example, a Graph Module, Story Module, Table Module etc.
